“Miss Lila Robinson” of Louisville, Kentucky received a “carte postale” (postcard, in French) from “Lt. [Lieutenant] E.D. Hill” written RQ 6 HSWHPEHU VLJQHG †*HQH . >)LJ. Robinson is in Louisville in the 1910 U.S. census at the street address written on the postcard, and she is shown as Lila H. Robinson in the 1920 U.S. census.⁴ \$ (XJHQH 'X%RVH WHOHSKRQH DQG WHC Louisville in the 1920 U.S. census.

The postcard has a censor’s stamp and was initially censored by the sender, which was permitted because he was an

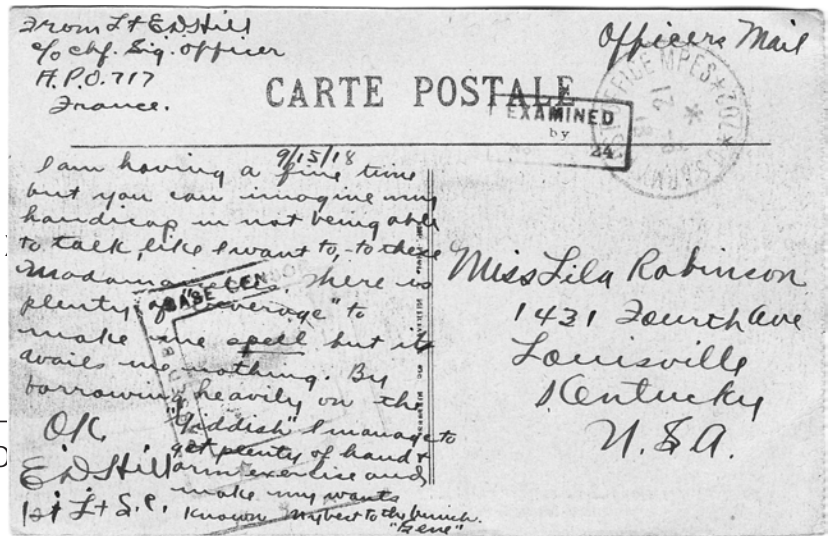

The “704” in the military postmark corresponds to La Valdahon, Doubs, France.¹¹ The front of the postcard

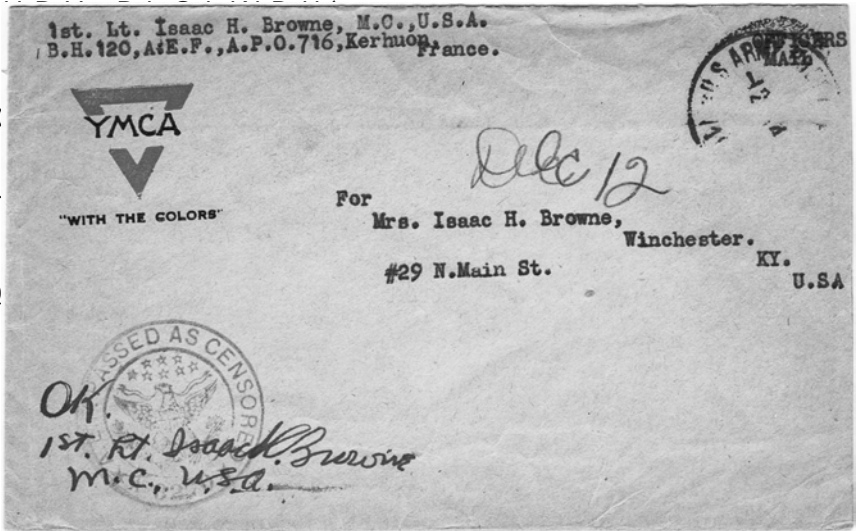

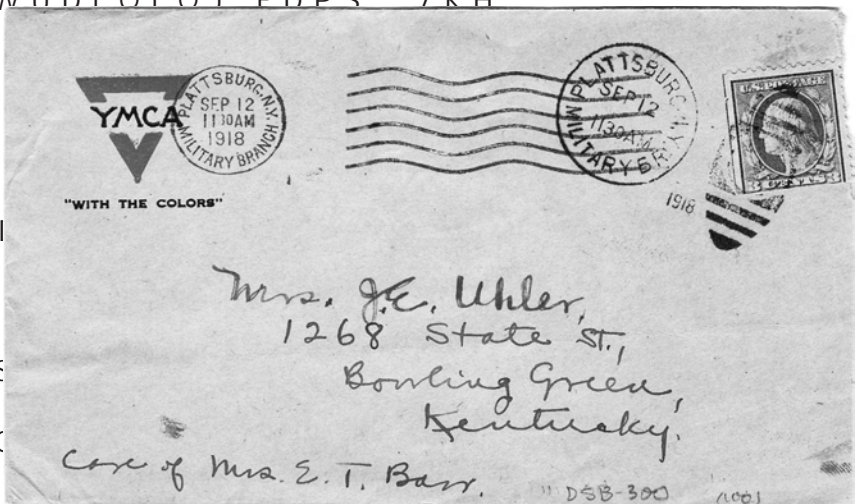
